Federal candidates were asked if they Support or Oppose:

- 1 H.AMDT.95 to H.R.1 (2011) would defund Planned Parenthood Federation of America.
- 2 Amendment No. 52 to H.R.1 (2011) Reduces funding by \$20 million for the National Endowment for the Arts and National Foundation on the Arts and Humanities.
- 3 H.Con.Res.35 to H.R.1473 would eliminate funding for the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (National Healthcare).
- 4 H.R.3 (2011) would ban the use of tax dollars to cover abortions.
- 5 H.R.1116 and S.598 (2011) would repeal the Defense of Marriage Act (DOMA), the federal law that defines marriage as one man and one woman.
- 6 H.R.2874 would restore funding to abstinence-centered sex ed programs without increasing federal spending.
- 7 H.R.1179 & S.1467 (2011) would allow medical personnel to be exempt from having to cover services and dispense items that violate their conscience.
- 8 H.R.2965 (became law 12/22/10) repealed the ban on homosexuals serving openly in the U.S. Armed Services.
- 9 Parental Rights Amendment would amend the U.S. Constitution, giving parents the sole responsibility to direct their children’s upbringing and education.

2012 Voter Guide | IL Senate & House Candidate Survey Questions

State candidates were asked if they Support or Oppose:

- A** SB 1716 creates civil unions for same-sex partners. (became law on 2/1/2011)
- B** HJRCA 10 and SJRCA 16 (2011) would amend the State Constitution by defining marriage as the union of one man and one woman.
- C** HB 30 (2011) would permit out-of-state patients to smoke marijuana for medical purposes without police interference; would permit authorized persons to grow and possess marijuana and operate a motor vehicle 6 hours after consumption.
- D** HB 148 (2011) would permit the county sheriff to issue permits to carry a concealed firearm to persons who meet certain requirements.
- E** SB 744 & SB 1849 (2011) would authorize 5 new casinos and slot machines at all race tracks.
- F** HB 3027 mandates that all Illinois school districts that teach sex ed in grades 6-12 use only “comprehensive sex ed” resources.
- G** HB 786 (2011) would require that a woman seeking an abortion be offered an opportunity to view an ultrasound picture of her unborn fetus.
- H** SB 2494 (2010) would authorize school tuition vouchers up to \$6,000 toward a school of the parent’s choice for students who attend one of the 49 under-performing Chicago public elementary schools.
- I** SB 2505 increased the income tax by 66% from 3% to 5%, and the corporate tax from 4.8% to 7%. (became law on 1/13/2011)
- J** SB 3539 repealed the state death penalty. (became law on 3-9-2011)
