Please remember not to register with ANYONE or fill out any papers from the school you will be removing your child from, if they already attend school. Illinois law DOES NOT require you to register your homeschool. You can find sample letters for withdrawing children from public schools HERE.

WE DO NOT REGISTER our homeschools with the state of IL

WE DO NOT REGISTER our homeschools with the ISBE

WE DO NOT REGISTER our homeschools with the local school

WE DO NOT REGISTER our homeschools with the ROE

Remember, your homeschool is considered a private school. We encourage you to give your homeschool a name.

Some asked for the webinar slide we used regarding the subjects Illinois law requires we cover:

## Illinois requires instruction in these subject areas:

- Language Arts
- Mathematics
- Biological and Physical Science
- Social Science (Social Studies)
- Fine Arts
- Physical Development and Health

You must offer education that is "at least commensurate with the standards prescribed for the public schools." (People vs. Levisen)

If your child requires special education, please know that the Homeschool Legal Defense Association (HSLDA) offers legal help.

Illinois allows for tax credits for home education. Download this document to learn more: <u>Homeschool Tax Credit Publication 119</u>

**Groups to join on Facebook**: Join to find out about homeschooling activities, field trips, discounts, buy/sell materials, co-ops etc. We recommend joining a bunch of groups. You don't have to go to all the activities, but feel free to pick and choose what works for your family.
