

HOW THEY VOTED

SB 818 — requires sex ed in Kindergarten to include teaching LGBTQ definitions and masturbation.

Became law.

HB 3195 — creates all-gender multiple occupancy public bathrooms. *PASSED House.*

VOTE: Villivalam ✓SPONSOR | Stoneback ✓SUPPORT

HB 24 — introduces 6th graders to sexting.

Became law.

HB 156 — puts tampons in boys bathrooms in public schools. *Became law.*

HB 3447 — felony reduction to misdemeanor for: possession of 40 Oxycodone pills; 40 LSD tabs; 5 Ecstasy pills; <3 grams Heroin, Fentanyl, Meth, PCP; <4 grams Morphine, Petazocine; <5 grams of Cocaine.

PASSED House.

HB 1063 — Removes criminal offense of transmission of HIV from Criminal Code of 1961 and 2012.

Became law.

SB 2136 — felony prostitution charges expunged.

Became law.

SB 1730 — requires corporations to report sexual orientation and self-identified gender of its directors.

Became law.

HB 135 — allows pharmacists to dispense prescription hormonal contraceptives. *Became law.*

HB 1871 — establishes vote by mail sites & curb-side voting; acceptance of mail ballots with no postage.

Became law.

HB 2789 — gives authority to Dept. of Public Health to close ALL nonpublic schools, including homeschools, if health emergency protocols are not followed.

PASSED House.

HB 709 — public information campaign that points illegal aliens to state and federal resources. *Became law.*

VOTE: Villivalam ✓SUPPORT | Stoneback ✓SUPPORT

HB 370 — Repeal of Parental Notice of Abortion. *PASSED both Houses; sent to governor.*

VOTE: Villivalam ✓SUPPORT | Stoneback ✓SUPPORT

SB 1169 — removes rights of conscience protection to refuse participation in medical procedures for COVID-19 pandemic. *PASSED both Houses; sent to governor.*
