We Have No Excuse!

If you are a citizen of the United States, you have a responsibility to participate in the political process by voting. Millions of people around the world do not have the gift of self-government. We should strive to be good stewards of this gift.



As Christians, we have a responsibility to ensure that we elect people of good character who will work to promote good and oppose bad public policy. Voting affords an opportunity to bring truth to the public square: namely, respect for the dignity of all human life and the promotion of Judeo-Christian values.

We have no good reason not to vote in the upcoming primary election. Voting has never been as easy and convenient as it is now.



- ★ **Vote by Mail:** If you prefer to vote early or cannot make it to the polls on Election Day, you can **vote by mail** by submitting an application to your local election clerk. Most county clerks offer an online application on their website. The deadline to apply online for a vote-by-mail ballot is October 29, 2026.
- ★ **Early Voting:** Registered voters can cast their ballot in person before Election Day without providing a reason. Early voting takes place at your local election authority's office or designated early voting sites and runs from September 24 through November 2, 2026.
- ★ **Grace Period Registration & Voting:** If you missed the regular deadline to register or update your address, you can still register and vote in person during the grace period. This option is available at your local election authority's office, participating early voting locations, and on Election Day.
- ★ **Election Day:** On November 3rd polls are open from 6 am – 7 pm.

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
